Why are we here and what is the issue we are seeking to address within your community?

The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) is seeking feedback about a proposed solution to improve traffic flow, minimize vehicular delays, and reduce crashes along CR 817/Lee Road and CR 818/South Sweetwater Road.

Current conditions along CR 817/Lee Road and CR 818/South Sweetwater Road

- Increasing traffic levels, vehicular delays, and high level of crashes
 - 2023 Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) along the corridor is 13,375 vehicles daily and currently operates at Level of Service (LOS)* C in the morning and D in the evening. Future (2051) traffic volumes are projected to be 18,675 vehicles daily operating at LOS D in the morning E in the evening.
 - For the three-year period from 2019 to 2021 (latest data available), crash rates and injury crash rates for this section of corridor were more than double the statewide average for a similar functional classification of road (Minor Arterial, Urbanized).
- Lee Road/South Sweetwater Road consists of two 12-ft lanes with rural/variable width grass shoulders and intermittent sidewalks.
- No raised medians to separate opposite moving traffic except a small portion of CR 817/Lee Road starting south from Vulcan Drive.

**LOS refers to the condition or performance of a roadway, with a score of "A" representing a highly performing roadway and an "F" representing a poorly performing roadway.*

Without this Project (No Build):

- Traffic levels would continue to increase
- Vehicular delays would continue to increase
- High number of vehicular crashes would not be addressed
- Sidewalks and shoulders would not be improved
- No medians would be added as a traffic control measure

Proposed Solution: (Also See Project Location Map & Proposed Typical Section Graphic, Attached)

In order to reduce crashes and improve traffic flow and vehicular delays, Douglas County proposes widening (CR) CR 817/Lee Road/South Sweetwater Road beginning at the intersection of Lee Road and Vulcan Drive and extending north approximately 1.4 miles to the intersection of South Sweetwater Road and US 78/SR 5/SR 8/Veterans Memorial Highway. From the southern terminus to Skyview drive, the proposed typical section would consist of a 4-lane divided urban section with four 11-ft lanes, 20-ft raised median, 2.5-ft curb & gutter, a 2-ft grass beauty strip, a 5-ft sidewalk along one shoulder and an 8-ft trail along the other. From Skyview Drive to US 78/SR 5/SR 8/Veterans Memorial Highway, the typical section would be a 3-lane urban section with two 11-ft lanes with a 14-ft two-way-left-turn-lane, 2.5-ft curb & gutter, a 2-ft grass beauty strip, a 5-ft sidewalk along one shoulder and an 8-ft multi-use trail along the other. The project also proposes to realign Lee Road/South Sweetwater Road as the through movement where Lee Road currently intersects Sweetwater Road at a T-intersection.

Benefits of Project Implementation:

- Improved traffic flow
- Decreased vehicular delays
- Reduced crash rates
- Improved pedestrian path facilities, shoulders and medians
- Other major intersections on the corridor would also benefit from these improvements

- Improved connectivity between activity centers in the eastern portion of the County and alternate routes for traffic around the City of Douglasville, which falls in line with the Douglas County Comprehensive Plan and Comprehensive Transportation Plan.

How Can You Assist: Please provide feedback about our proposed solution as well as information about any resources important to you or to the community. Are there events that future construction may affect once it begins?

Where is this project in the process? This project is currently in the concept phase. The concept phase defines the existing issue seeking to be resolved along with a proposed solution that will meet the community's needs.

What are the Next Steps? After the public meeting is held, feedback will be assessed, revisions may occur to the proposed plan initially brought to the public, or the no build alternative will be selected. Once a Concept Report is approved, the project alignment would be refined. If major changes occur to what was previously shown to the community, additional public outreach would occur. If no major changes are proposed, the project would advance to right-of-way acquisition and into final design. After all right-of-way acquisition occurs, project design is finalized, and the project would advance to construction.

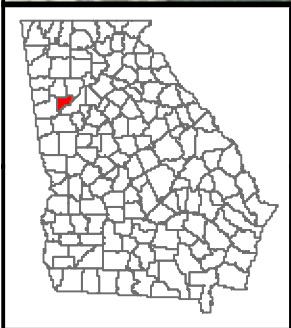
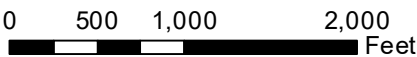


Figure 1. Project Location Map

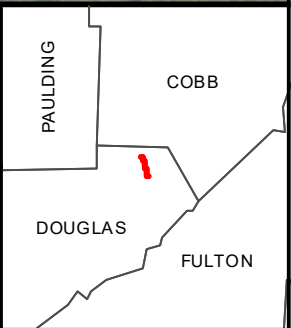
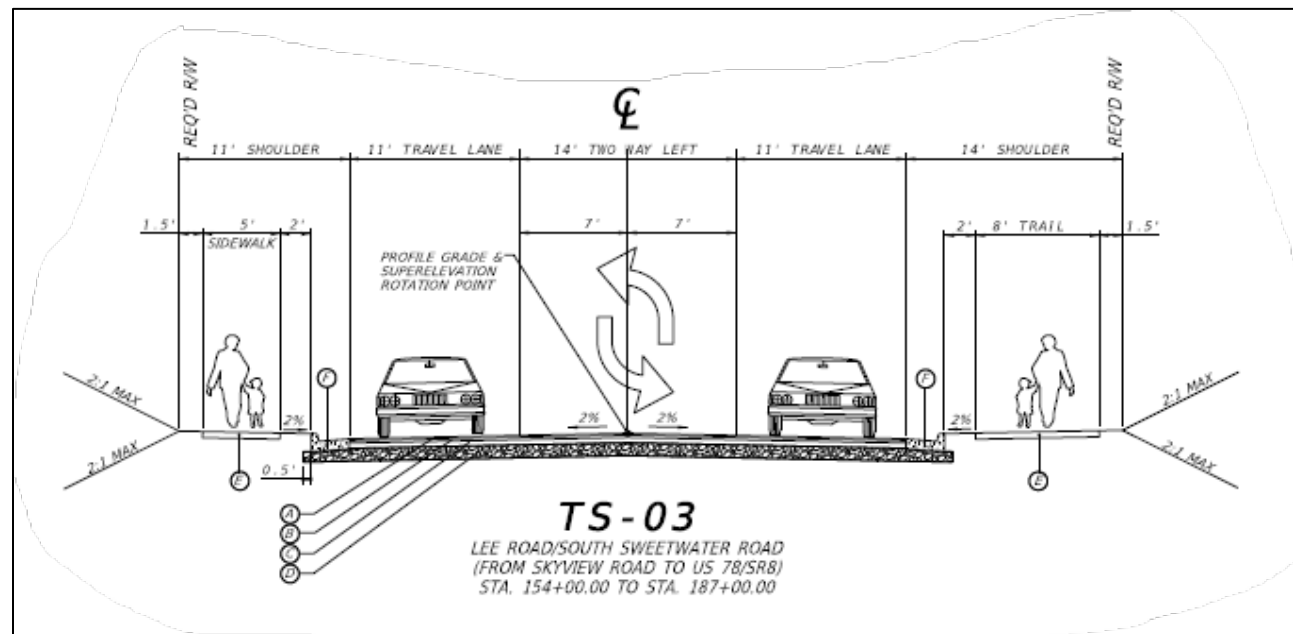
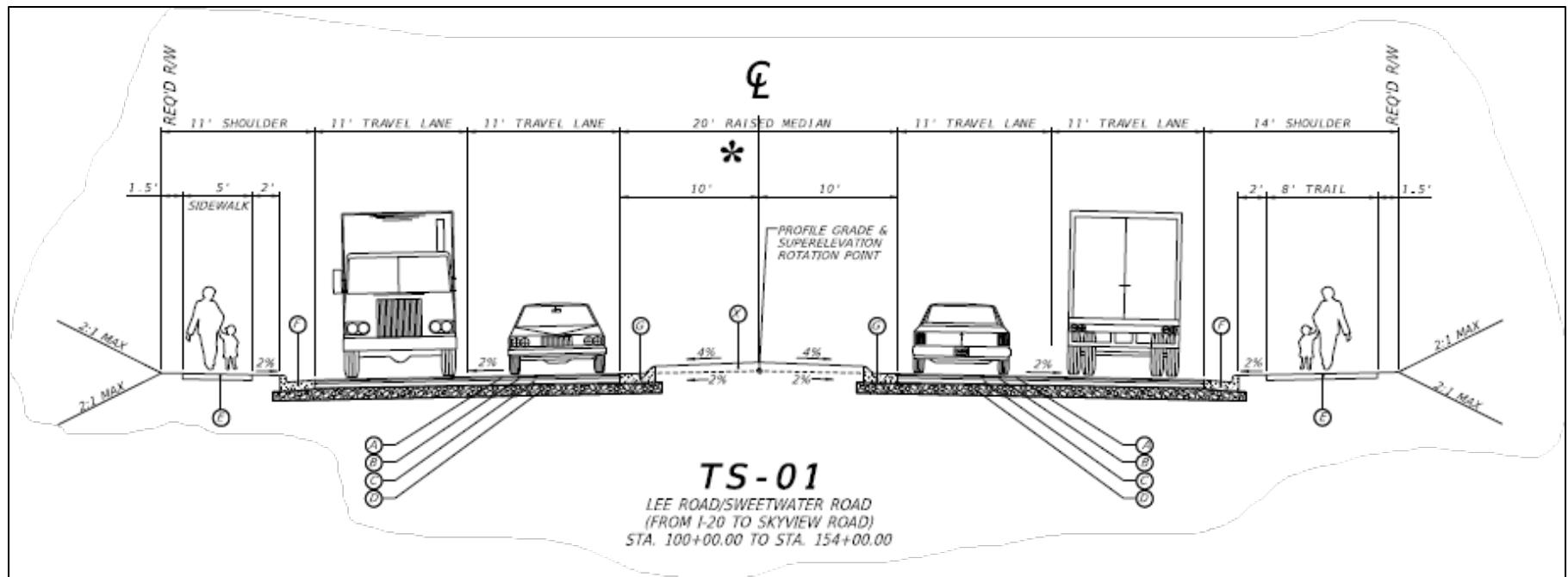


Figure 2: Proposed Typical Section Graphic
