**STANDING ORDER REGARDING THE USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN DOCUMENTS  
FILED IN THE DOUGLAS COUNTY JUVENILE COURT**

**WHEREAS**, Artificial Intelligence ("AI") can be and is often used to assist in drafting documents and conducting legal research; and

**WHEREAS**, the use of generative AI, for example, CHATGPT, Co-Counsel, etc., creates a risk to the security of confidential information, including the identification of children, in that the corporate owner of the AI program may retain access to such confidential information; and

**WHEREAS**, the accuracy of legal citations is critical to the integrity of legal documents filed in the court, and the use of generative AI increases the potential that documents will include fabricated citations,

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that no confidential or sensitive information should be disclosed when using any generative AI program for research or to create legal documents.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that any document created with the assistance of generative AI must contain a certification at the end of the document stating that the document has been independently reviewed for accuracy, legitimacy, and the validity of legal citations and quoted language.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that documents not in compliance with this order shall result in the Court taking appropriate action, including, without limitation, striking the filing, imposing sanctions, or making the appropriate disciplinary referral.

**Note: The use of AI does not relieve any attorney or pro se litigant of their ethical or professional obligations, including those found under the Georgia Rule of Professional Conduct, the Juvenile Court Rules, or other applicable laws or rules.**

This order is effective immediately and applies to all filings submitted after the date of entry.
