

ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Douglas County Board of Commissioners is authorized to adopt ordinances and regulations for the governing and policing of the unincorporated area of the County for the purpose of protecting and preserving the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Douglas County Board of Commissioners that **Article II of Chapter 3** of the Douglas County Board of Commissioners relating to **Alcoholic Beverages, Section 3.27(i) (Standards for licenses)** is amended as follows:

Section 1.

Douglas County Code Section 3.27(i) relating to Standards for licenses is hereby amended as follows:

- **Sec. 3-27(i). - Standards for licenses.**

(i) Effective January 8, 2019, January 1, 2003, within sixty (60) days of the issuance of any new alcohol license, or prior to any alcohol license renewal, the licensee must provide proof that all employees and managers involved in the sale or service of alcoholic beverages have successfully taken within the previous year, satisfactorily completed a comprehensive alcohol compliance training course an examination, approved by the board of commissioners Director of Development Services. Employees and managers must complete such yearly training within six (6) months of such examination commencing work or being hired, whichever is shorter. Documentation of each employee's and manager's date of hire and proof of training successful completion of the examination within the previous year must be attached to all renewal applications and must be maintained on the premises, and posted in a prominent location and available for public inspection at all times during which the location is open for business and engaged in alcohol sales for off-premises consumption. Employees and managers who directly serve alcoholic beverages to patrons for on-premises consumption shall be required to keep their server badge on their person while at work documentation verifying that they have completed their annual RASS training as required under this article. All employees and managers subject to this subsection must attend an approved training course at least once a year. Such training shall be at the expense of the licensee or the licensed establishment.

Section 2.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed.

Section 3.

This Ordinance is approved and shall become effective on this 8th day of January, 2019.
