The Douglas County Fire/EMS Department exists to improve and protect the quality of life within our service area through education, prevention & emergency response.

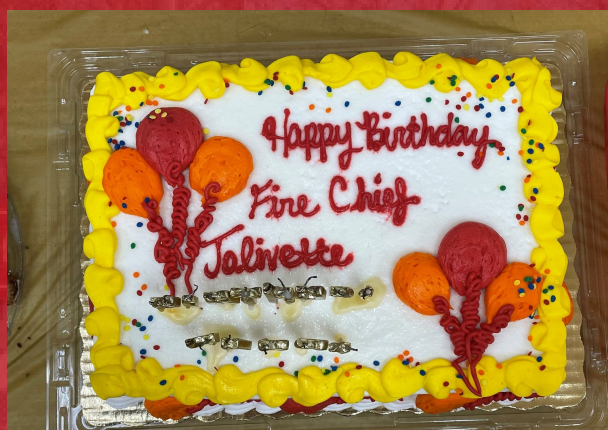
